## FIRE SUPPRESSION AGREEMENT WITH THE RESORT VILLAGE OF ISLAND VIEW

THIS AGREEMENT is made in duplicate effective on this 315T

BETWEEN:

The Resort Village of Island View

Comp. 3, R.R. 1

Bulyea, Saskatchewan S0G 0L0

(in this Agreement referred to as the "Resort Village")

AND

The Town of Strasbourg

P.O. Box 369

Strasbourg, Saskatchewan S0G 4V0

(in this Agreement referred to as the "Town")

WHEREAS the Resort Village requires fire suppression and rescue services for its residents and ratepayers;

WHEREAS the Town has agreed to provide such services to the Resort Village through the Strasbourg & District Fire & Rescue (hereinafter referred to as "SDFR") upon the Resort Village's request and in exchange for compensation as described herein;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

## SERVICE PROVISION

- 1.1 The Town shall provide fire suppression and rescue services to the entirety of the Resort Village when called upon to do so by provincial dispatch, subject to the limitations and conditions hereinafter set forth.
- 1.2 Fire suppression and rescue services are provided by SDFR as a single, integrated service to ensure operational efficiency, cost-effectiveness, and readiness for all emergencies.

## 2. FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTIONS

- 2.1 The Resort Village shall pay the Town an annual fire suppression and rescue levy as outlined in Schedule "A" to this Agreement (collectively referred to as the "Levy"). For the purposes of this Agreement, the fire suppression levy and the rescue levy are separated out for more description and transparency, but the levies are merged and paid as one.
- 2.2 In addition to the Levy, the Resort Village shall pay all invoices for fire call-outs, mutual aid, and additional charges as per Schedule "B" to this Agreement within forty-five (45) days of issuance. The Town will endeavour to invoice all fire call-outs, mutual aid callouts, and additional charges no later than (1) month from the incident date to ensure that all relevant invoices pertaining to the incident have been received by the Town.

- 2.3 The Levy shall be paid by April 15 of each year for which this Agreement is in force. If this Agreement is terminated in accordance with Article 7, the Levy shall be pro-rated and paid or reimbursed accordingly, as the case may be.
- 2.4 The Town reserves the right to suspend fire suppression and rescue services to the Resort Village if the Resort Village fails to pay any amount due pursuant to this Agreement within, after providing written notice of delinquency and the expiration of a fourteen (14) day grace period:

2.4.1 Forty-five (45) days for invoices related to call-outs, mutual aid, and additional charges as contemplated at section 2.2 herein; and

2.4.2 Ninety (90) days for the Levy.

## 3. EQUIPMENT & CAPABILITIES

- 3.1 Fire suppression and rescue services are subject to the availability of equipment, trained volunteer firefighters, and water supply. The Town makes no representation, warranty, or guarantee whatsoever in relation to the availability of equipment, trained volunteer firefighters, or water supply.
- 3.2 The current inventory of SDFR equipment and capabilities is outlined in Schedule "C" to this Agreement. The Town will notify the Resort Village on any major equipment or capability changes that would affect providing service to the Resort Village as soon as the change occurs. Any other changes will be communicated at the Planning Meeting.

## 4. ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS

- 4.1 The Town shall provide annual written updates and host at least one (1) collaborative planning meeting ("Planning Meeting") with all entities receiving services from SDFR ("Participant Entities"). Meeting minutes shall be recorded and made available to all Participant Entities.
- 4.2 Planning Meetings are for the express purpose of providing a forum for Participant Entities to provide input on the following items:
  - a. Capital equipment purchases; and
  - b. Enhancements for regional fire and rescue capacity, including without limitation water sources, municipal bylaw changes, on-site practice exercises.
- 4.3 Each Participant Entity is required to appoint at least one (1) representative to attend the Planning Meeting.
- 4.4 Participating in Planning Meetings does not grant Participant Entities management or regulatory authority over the SDFR.
- 4.5 In the event of a fire or other emergency within the Resort Village, the SDFR shall, upon the Resort Village's request, debrief the Resort Village Council within one (1) month of such emergency or such other longer period as may be reasonable in the circumstances.

## 5. FIRE BANS

5.1 If the Resort Village intends to implement or remove a fire ban, the SDFR Fire Chief and Town CAO shall be notified via email and telephone as per Subsection 9.1 and Subsection 9.3 of this Agreement. The Resort Village shall endeavour to provide the

SDFR and the Town with as much notice of the implementation and/or removal of a fire ban as is reasonably practicable in the circumstances.

5.2 It is recommended that the Resort Village consult with the SDFR Fire Chief prior to implementing a fire ban.

## 6. ROAD CLOSURES

6.1 If the Resort Village closes or is aware of a closed road, the SDFR Fire Chief and Town CAO shall be notified as soon as reasonably practicable by email and telephone as per Subsection 9.1 and Subsection 9.3 of this Agreement.

## 7. AGREEMENT TERMS & TERMINATION

- 7.1 This Agreement constitutes the only agreement between the Parties regarding the subject matter hereof, and supersedes any prior agreements between the Parties regarding fire suppression and rescue services.
- 7.2 This Agreement shall remain in force indefinitely, unless and until terminated by one of the Parties in accordance with this Article 7.
- 7.3 Upon the request of either Party, this Agreement may be reviewed and, upon mutual agreement of the Parties, amended, no more frequently than every two (2) years to assess service provisions, operational effectiveness, and necessary updates, including but not limited to assessment adjustments, Levy adjustments, and Service Fee adjustments. For greater certainty, this Agreement shall remain in force unless and until terminated in accordance with its provisions, regardless of whether or not a review has taken place under this section.
- 7.4 Either Party may terminate this Agreement by providing one (1) year's written notice to the other Party.
- 7.5 In addition, either Party may terminate this Agreement where:
  - 7.5.1 The other Party has committed one or more legal violations of this Agreement; or
  - 7.5.2 The other Party has committed one or more significant breaches of this Agreement;

In the circumstances described in 7.5.1 or 7.5.2, the Party seeking to terminate the agreement shall provide the other party with written notice of the violation or breach and a minimum of sixty (60) days notice to cure the violation or breach. Should the Party receiving such notice fail to cure the violation or breach within 60 days, this Agreement may be terminated with immediate effect upon notice in writing to the other Party. Significant breaches include, but are not limited to, failure to provide agreedupon services, repeated non-payment, safety violations, or any other material failure to comply with the terms of this Agreement.

- 7.6 This Agreement may be terminated by either Party upon sixty (60) days written notice in the event of an occurrence of a force majeure.
- 7.7 Any rights of termination under this Article 7 do not detract from and are in addition to the right of the Town to suspend services for non-payment pursuant to section 2.4 hereof.

8. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- 8.1 The Resort Village and Town shall attempt in good faith to resolve any dispute or claim arising out of or in relation to this Agreement through negotiations between representatives from each of the Councils with authority to settle the relevant dispute.
- 8.2 Any Party raising a dispute shall provide written notice to the other Party, outlining the nature of the dispute and proposed resolution steps.
- 8.3 If unresolved within fourteen (14) days of written notice, the dispute shall proceed to mediation.
- 8.4 If mediation does not result in a resolution within thirty (30) days, the dispute shall be referred to binding arbitration in accordance with The Arbitration Act, 1992 (Saskatchewan) unless otherwise agreed to by the Parties.

## 9. GENERAL

9.1 Any notice, request, demand or other communication required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed properly given if delivered personally, sent by registered mail, or transmitted by email (with confirmation of receipt) to the following addresses:

Total Assessment for Resort Village Fire Suppression Service Area Fire Suppression Contract Area = Fire Operating & Capital Budget Levy Total Assessment of Fire Suppression Contract Area

- 1.2 The Total Assessment for the Resort Village Fire Suppression Service Area at the time of signing this Agreement is \$44,069,000.
- 1.3 The Total Assessment for the Fire Suppression Contract Area serviced by the SDFR at the time of signing this Agreement is \$428,218,798.
- 1.4 The Fire Suppression Contract Area Operating and Capital Budget represents a portion of the fire suppression services as set out by the Town of Strasbourg for necessary operation of the SDFR. The full operating and capital budget at the time of signing this Agreement is \$132,000 (60% operating, 40% capital). The Town of Strasbourg is responsible for 50% of the budget cost or \$66,000. The Fire Suppression Contract Area is responsible for the remaining \$66,000 and represents the Contract Area Portion of the Fire Suppression Operating & Capital Budget.

# 2. RESCUE SERVICES LEVY FORMULA

2.1 The Resort Village shall make an annual financial contribution to the Town of Strasbourg for rescue services by the following formula

Total Assessment for Resort Village Rescue Service Area Rescue Service Contract Area = Fire Operating & Capital Budget Levy Total Assessment of Rescue Service Contract Area

- 2.2 The Total Assessment for the Resort Village Rescue Service Area at the time of signing this Agreement is \$44,069,000.
- 2.3 The Total Assessment for the Rescue Service Contract Area serviced by the SDFR at the time of signing this Agreement is \$887,334,700.
- 2.4 The Rescue Service Contract Area Operating and Capital Budget represents a portion of the rescue services as set out by the Town of Strasbourg for necessary operation of the SDFR. The full operating and capital budget at the time of signing this Agreement is \$33,000 (60% operating, 40% capital). The Town of Strasbourg is responsible for 50% of the budget cost or \$16,500. The Rescue Service Contract Area is responsible for the remaining \$16,500 and represents the Contract Area Portion of the Rescue Service Operating & Capital Budget.

  - a. 2011 Rosenbauer Tanker/Pumper Fire Truck
  - b. 2000 GMC Fire Truck
  - c. 1996 International Rescue Truck with associated equipment
  - d. Holmatro Pentheon Rescue Tools including cutter, spreader, combi-tool, ram, and air bag lifter
  - e. Thirty (30)+ trained Volunteer Firefighters
  - f. Ten (10) complete breathing apparatuses with twenty (20) spare air bottles, and a 6,000 psi air compressor which can fill 23 air bottles in 60 minutes
  - g. Various other tools, ladders, hoses, nozzles, etc.
- 1.2 Every fire and rescue call-out are attended by the Tanker/Pumper Truck, the Fire Truck, and Rescue Truck simultaneously, and by all members available.

## 2. CAPABILITIES & SERVICES

- 2.1 The SDFR has the following capabilities and can offer the following services:
  - a. Offensive Firefighting entering a burning structure when a live person is known to be inside or something of significance is to be gained all while wearing approved breathing apparatuses
  - b. Defensive Firefighting protecting surroundings from nearby fire; nothing is to be gained by firefighting offensively
  - c. Wildland Firefighting
  - d. Level II Vehicular Rescue removal of victims from all types of vehicles after an incident in coordination with EMS
  - e. Fire Investigation investigations into all types of fires for cause and origin
  - f. STARS Landings Assistance as required at accident scenes and for EMS upon request
  - g. Hazardous Good incident Attendance as required
  - h. Confined Space Entry and Grain Rescue rescue from grain bins, grain trucks, etc.
  - i. Basic Rope Rescue as required
  - Search and Rescue Assistance as required
  - k. Trench Rescue & Structural Collapse Support Operations as required
  - Rapid Intervention Rescue as required
- 2.2 The SDFR can also offer the following to communities:
  - a. Outreach Fire Prevention & Training
  - b. Parade Attendance
- 2.3 The SDFR members train in-house monthly and on other occasions as planned.
- 2.4 The SDFR holds annual memberships and attend frequent meetings and training sessions with the Saskatchewan Volunteer Fire Fighters Association (SVFFA) and the Saskatchewan Association of Fire Chiefs (SAFC).
- 2.5 All fire and rescue reports are filed with the Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency (SPSA).

WHEREAS, the Resort Village of Island View requires fire suppression services for their ratepayers as listed in Schedule "A".

WHEREAS, The Village of Silton has agreed to provide fire suppression services to The Resort Village of Island View and The Resort Village of Island View has agreed to make financial contributions as set out in 3.

WHEREAS, The Resort Village of Island View recognizes that land without improvements or buildings still requires fire suppression services.

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained and other goods and valuable consideration, the parties hereto agree as follows:

#### 1. Service Area

1.1. The Village of Silton does hereby agree to provide fire suppression services to the Resort Village of Island View as listed in Schedule "A".

#### 2. Service and Equipment

- 2.1. The provision of fire suppression services by the Village of Silton at any given time shall be subject to the availability of equipment, volunteer firefighter, and supply of water at the time of a fire.
- 2.2. The Resort Village of Island View assumes no ownership of any equipment purchased or obtained by the Village of Silton for fire suppression services.

#### 3. Financial Contribution

3.1. The Resort Village of Island View shall make an annual financial contribution as calculated by the following formula:

2023-year (The total number of lots/properties within the service area) x (\$25.00 per lot/property)

Consecutive years (The total number of lots/properties within the service area) x (\$25.00 per lot/property)

- 3.2. The annual contribution shall be due and payable no later than January 31st of each year.
- 3.3. The Village of Silton reserves the right to discontinue fire suppression services to The Resort Village of Island View from non-payment of the annual contribution, ninety (90) days from the due date.

#### 4. General Provisions

- 4.1. The Village of Silton shall supply the Resort Village of Island View with annual operation and capital budgets for fire suppression services annually, no later than March 31st of each year.
- 4.2. If, in the event of a fire or other emergency within the Resort Village of Island View the Village of Silton shall debrief the Resort Village of Island View no later than one (1) month after the emergency, if requested by the Resort Village of Island View or the Village of Silton.
- 4.3. The parties shall take all such further actions and execute all such further deeds and documents as shall be reasonably required to fully perform and carry out the terms of this Agreement.
- 4.4. This Agreement shall be construed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the Province of Saskatchewan and the laws of Canada applicable therein.
- 4.5. This agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts each of which when so executed shall be deemed to be an original and such counterparts together shall constitute but one of the same instrument.
- 4.6. It is expressly understood and agreed by the parties hereto that the Village of Silton, its councillors, employees, and the SFD volunteers, shall not in any manner be liable for its failure to respond to any fire or rescue calls, or be liable for damage to property or persons occasioned by fire, water, or for any other reason whatsoever, including misfeasance, nonfeasance, or negligence on the part of the Village of Silton and its Councillors, employees and the SFD and its volunteers while attending a fire or rescue call or travelling to or from a fire or rescue call.
- 4.7. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the heirs, successors, administrators, and permitted assigns of the parties.

#### 5. Dispute Resolution

5.1. The Resort Village of Island View and the Village of Silton will attempt in good faith to resolve any dispute or claim arising out of or in relation to this Agreement through negotiations between representatives from each of the Councils with authority to settle the relevant dispute. If the dispute cannot be settled amicably within fourteen (14) days from the date on

- which either the Village of Silton or the Resort Village of Island View has served written notice on the other of the dispute, then the remaining provisions of Subsection 5.2 shall apply.
- 5.2. In the event of a dispute between the Resort Village of Island View and the Village of Silton (other than a matter to be resolved pursuant to Subsection 5.1) concerning the interpretation of any provision of this Agreement or the performance of any of the terms of this Agreement, such matter or matters in dispute shall be finally settled by mediation.

#### 6. Agreement Term and Termination

Administrator

- 6.1. This agreement shall have an indefinite term.
- 6.2. For the purposes of updating the number of lots/properties and the dollar amount per property used for the annual contribution calculations the Resort Village of Island View will supply the Village of Silton the current number of properties at the end of each year.
- 6.3. This agreement shall be terminated by the Village of Silton or the Resort Village of Island View by provision of written notice at least sixty (60) days prior to the intended termination date.
- 7. This Agreement shall become binding upon the passing of a resolution by the Resort Village of Island View Council expressly ratifying the same. It is agreed that upon passing of such resolution, a certified copy of the same shall be provided by the Resort Village of Island View to the Village of Silton's Chief Administrative Officer.

## A BYLAW OF THE RESORT VILLAGE OF ISLAND VIEW RESPECTING BUILDING

THE RESORT VILLAGE OF ISLAND VIEW IN THE PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. This Bylaw may be cited as the Building Bylaw
- 2. The following terms and phrases shall be interpreted as follows:
  - a) "Act" means the "Uniform Building and Accessibility Standards Act" Chapter U-1.2 of the Statutes of Saskatchewan, 1983-84 amendments.
  - b) "Administrative Requirements" means The Administrative Requirements for Use with the National Building Code.
  - c) Authorized Representative means a building official appointed by the local authority pursuant to subsection 5(4) of the Act or the Administrator or Clerk.
  - d) "Local Authority" means the Resort Village of Island View.
  - e) "Regulations" means regulations pursuant to the Act.
  - f) Definitions contained in the Act and Regulations shall apply in this bylaw.

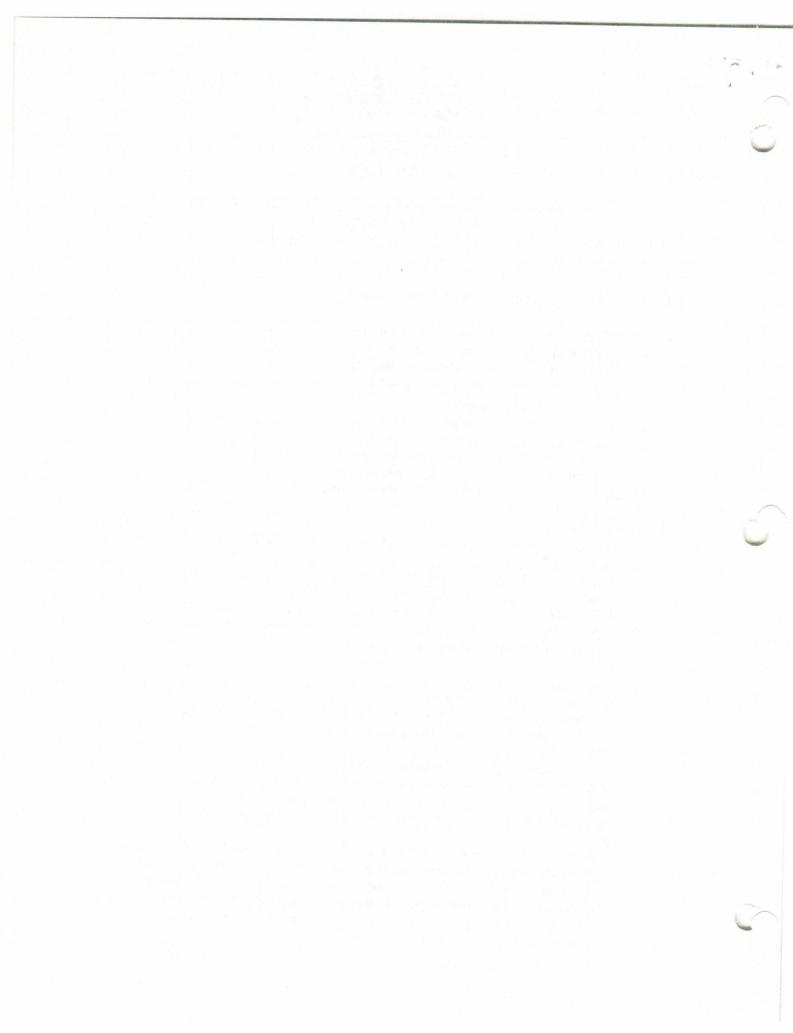
## Scope of the Bylaw

- a) This bylaw applies to matters governed by the Act and the Regulations, including the National Building Code of Canada and the Administrative Requirements.
- b) References and requirements in the Administrative Requirements respecting matters regulated by the Act and Regulations shall not apply.
- c) References and requirements in the Administrative Requirements With respect to "Occupancy Permits" shall not apply except as and when required by the local authority or its authorized representative.

#### 4. General

- a) A building permit is required whenever work regulated by the Act and Regulations is to be undertaken.
- b) No owner or owners agent shall work or authorize work or allow work to proceed on any project for which a building permit is required unless a valid permit exists for the work to be done.
- c) The issuance of a permit authorized by this bylaw shall not: entitle the holder, his successor, assigns or anyone on his behalf to erect any building that fails to comply with the requirements of any building restriction agreement, bylaw, act and/or regulation affecting the site described in the permit,

make either the local authority or its authorized representative liable for damages or otherwise because a building, the construction, erection, placement, alteration, repair, renovation, demolition, relocation, removal, use or occupancy that has been authorized by a building permit, does not comply with the requirements of any building restriction or agreement, bylaw, act and/or regulation pertaining to the site described in the permit.



5. Building Permits

a) Every application for a building permit to construct, erect, alter, repair, renovate or reconstruct a building shall be in Form A. It shall be accompanied by two sets of plans and specifications of the proposed building, except when the local authority or its authorized representative states that plans and/or specifications need not be submitted.

b) If the work described in the building permit application, to the best of the knowledge of the local authority or its authorized representative, complies with the requirements of this bylaw, the local authority, upon receipt of the prescribed fee, shall issue a building permit in Form B and return one set of submitted plans to the applicant.

c) The local authority may have plan review, inspection and other services for the purpose of enforcement of the Act and Regulations provided by building officials designated by the minister to assist the local authority pursuant to subsection 4(4)

of the Act.

d) The local authority may have plan review, inspection and other services provided the person, firm, or corporation employed under contract to the local authority.

e) The building permit fee for construction, erection, placement, alteration, repair, renovation or reconstruction of a building shall be based on the following fee schedule:

# The greater of \$5.00 per \$1,000.00 of value or the cost of the plan review

f) The local authority may estimate the value of construction for the work described in a building permit application for to determine a fee, based on established construction cost, owners statement of costs or constructors contract values, or similar methods selected by the local authority.

g) Written approval from the local authority or its authorized representative is required for any deviation, omission or revision to work for which a building

permit has been issued under this section.

h) Permits issued under this section expire: Six months from the date of issue if work is not commenced within that period, or If work is suspended for six months, or If the work is suspended for a period of more than six months by prior written approval of the local authority or its representative.

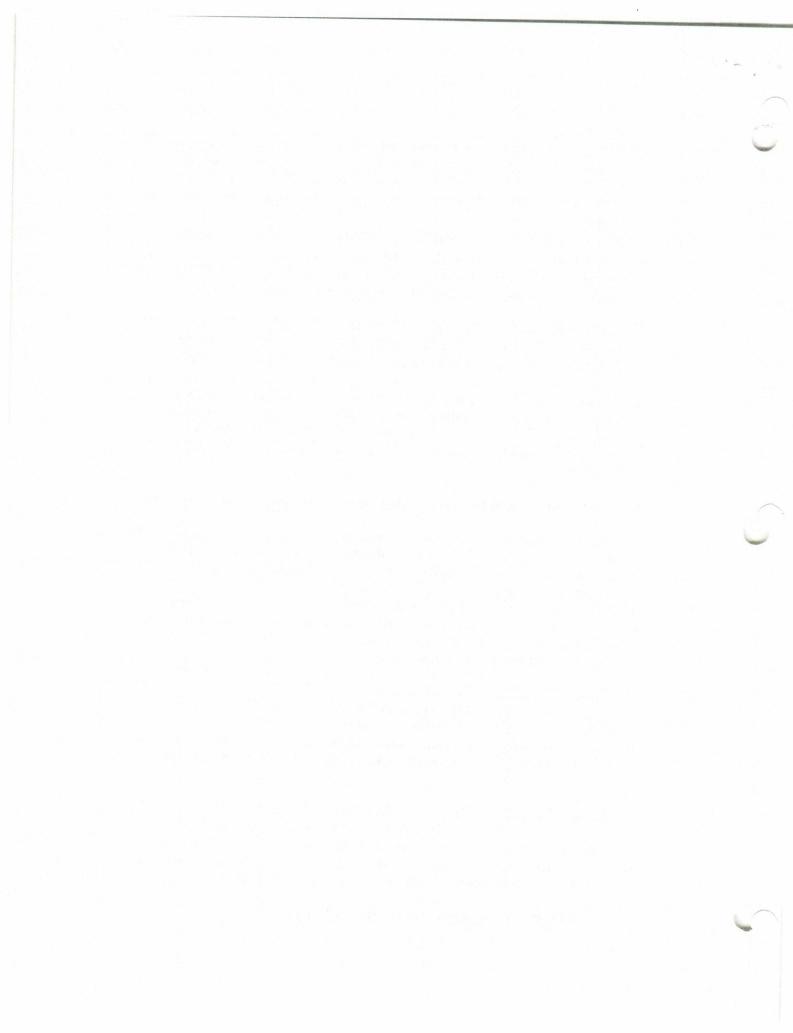
i) The local authority may rebate a portion of the permit fee where work is reduced in scope or discontinued, or where other exceptional circumstances occur.

## Demolition or Removal Permits

a) 1) The fee for a demolition or removal permit shall be \$25.00

2) The applicant shall deposit with the local authority the following sum to cover the cost of restoring the site after the building has been demolished or removed to such condition that it is in the opinion of the local authority or its authorized representative, not dangerous to public safety.

# \$500.00 deposit payable to the Resort Village of Island View



- 3) If the applicant restores the site to a condition satisfactory to the local, authority or its authorized representative, the deposit, or a portion of it shall be refunded.
- b) Every application to remove or demolish a building shall be in form C.
- c) Where a building is to be either moved, removed or demolished and the local authority or its authorized representative is satisfied that there are no debts or taxes in arrears or taxes outstanding with respect to the building or the land upon which the building is situated, the local authority, upon receipt of the fee and prescribed deposit, shall issue a removal or demolition permit in Form D.
- d) Once completed buildings moved to another site within the local authority shall conform to the requirements of this or any other applicable bylaw and upon payment of the prescribed fee and deposit a removal permit shall be issued in Form D.
- e) Buildings shall not be moved to another site within the local authority until: the prescribed fee set out in 6 (a) 1) has been paid the required deposit set out in 6(a) 2) has been made a permit has been issued for placement of the building in Form B.
- Permits issued under this section expire six months from the date of issue however a permit may upon written application to the local authority be renewed for six months.
- Enforcement of the Bylaw
  - a) If any building, part of a building or addition to a building is constructed, erected, placed, altered, repaired, renovated or reconstructed in contravention of any provision of this bylaw, the local authority or its authorized representative may take any measures permitted by virtue of Part V of the Act for the purpose of ensuring compliance with this bylaw including but not limited to:
    - 1) entering the building
    - 2) ordering production of documents, tests, certificates, etc. related to the building
    - 3) taking material supplies
    - 4) issuing notices to owners that order actions within a prescribed time
    - 5) eliminating unsafe conditions
    - 6) completing actions, upon an owners non compliance with an order and adding the expenses incurred to the tax payable on the property
    - 7) obtaining restraining orders.
    - b) If any building or part of a building, is in an unsafe condition due to its faulty structure, dilapidated condition, abandonment, open or unguarded condition or for any other reason, the local authority or its authorized representative may take any measures allowed by subsection (1).
    - c) The owner of a building for which a building permit has been issued or for which actions are being taken in compliance with an order shall give written notice to the local authority as required in Section 17.2 of the Act including but not limited
      - 1) on start, progress and completion of construction,
      - 2) of change in ownership prior to completion of construction,
      - 3) of intended partial occupancy prior to completion of construction

8. Special Conditions

a) Irrespective of the requirements of the regulations, an architect or professional engineer registered in the province of Saskatchewan shall be engaged by the owner for assessment of design and inspection of construction or certification of a building or part of a building if required by the local authority or its authorized representative.

b) An up to date plan of survey of the site described in a building permit or Building permit application prepared by a registered land surveyor shall be submitted by the owner where required by the local authority or its authorized representative.

c) It shall be the responsibility of the owner to ensure that changes in property lines and/or changes in ground elevations will not bring the building or an adjacent building into contravention of this bylaw.

d) It shall be the responsibility of the owner to arrange for all permits, inspections and certificates required by other applicable bylaws, acts and regulations.

9. Penalty

a) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this bylaw shall be liable to the penalties provided for in Section 22 of the Act.

b) Conviction of a person or corporation for breach of any provision of this bylaw shall not relieve him from compliance with the bylaw.

10. Coming into Force

This bylaw shall come into force on the day it is approved by the Minister of Municipal Affaires, Culture & Housing.

Bylaw 11-99 is hereby repealed.

**LOCAL AUTHORITY** 

#### A BYLAW RESPECTING BUILDINGS

The Council of the	of	
in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:		

#### **SHORT TITLE**

1 This bylaw may be cited as the Building Bylaw.

#### PURPOSE OF THE BUILDING BYLAW

2 The purpose of this bylaw is to provide for the administration and enforcement of the Act, the regulations, the National Building Code of Canada, the National Energy Code of Canada for Buildings, ministerial interpretations and Saskatchewan Construction Standards Appeal Board orders and building official orders within the local authority.

## INTERPRETATION/LEGISLATION

**3** Definitions contained in *The Construction Codes Act, The Building Code Regulations* and *The Energy Code Regulations* shall apply in this building bylaw.

"Act" means The Construction Codes Act.

"building official" means a person who holds a building official licence.

"building official services" means plan review services, inspection services and enforcement services carried out by an appointed building official.

"certificate of occupancy" means a written document issued by the local authority giving the owner of the building permission to occupy the building for its intended use.

"competent person" means a person who is recognized by the local authority as having:

- (a) a degree, certificate or professional designation; or
- (b) the knowledge, experience and training; necessary to design or review the design of a building.

"inspection" means the inspection of the following by an appointed building official to ascertain whether the Act and the regulations have been or are being complied with:

(a) ongoing or incomplete building construction, materials of construction or building systems;

(b) completed or existing building construction, materials of construction or building systems.

"local authority" means the municipality to which this Building Bylaw applies.

"NBC" means the edition and provisions of the National Building Code of Canada, including revisions, errata and amendments to it, declared to be in force pursuant to the Act and the regulations.

"NECB" means the edition and provisions of the National Energy Code of Canada for Buildings, including revisions, errata and amendments to it, declared to be in force pursuant to the Act and *The Energy Code Regulations*.

#### "owner" means:

- (a) any person who has any right, title, estate or interest in land, improvements or premises other than that of a mere occupant, tenant or mortgagee;
- (b) any person, firm or corporation that controls the property under consideration; or
- (c) if the building is owned separately from the land on which the building is located, the owner of the building.

"owner's representative" means any person, corporation, employee or contractor who has authority to act on behalf of an owner.

"permit" means written authorization issued by the local authority or its building official.

"plan review" means the examination of building drawings and related documents by a building official to ascertain whether those drawings and documents meet the requirements of the Act and the regulations.

"regulations" means The Building Code Regulations and The Energy Code Regulations.

**"SAMA fee"** means a fee charged to the local authority by the Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency with respect to the work.

"value of construction" means the total costs to the owner for the building construction in its completed form and includes the cost of all building work, materials of construction, building systems, labour and overhead, and profit of the contractor and subcontractors.

"work" means any design, construction, addition, erection, placement, alteration, repair, renovation, demolition, relocation, removal, use, change of use, occupancy or change of occupancy of a building.

#### SCOPE OF THE BYLAW

**4** This building bylaw applies to all work undertaken or to be undertaken within the geographical jurisdiction of the local authority.

#### **GENERAL**

- **5**(1) It is the duty of every owner or the owner's representative of a building in Saskatchewan to ensure that the building and work is in accordance with the Act, the regulations, any associated codes, interpretations and orders and any bylaws adopted by the local authority with which the building is associated.
- (2) It shall be the responsibility of the owner or the owner's representative to arrange for all permits, inspections and certificates required by any other applicable bylaws, Acts and regulations.
- (3) A building or part of a building for which a permit has been granted shall not be occupied before the issuance of a certificate of occupancy by the local authority or the building official pursuant to clause 16(11)(h) of the Act.
- (4) The provisions of this building bylaw apply to buildings greater than 10m² (107.6 ft²) in building area except as otherwise exempted by the Act or the regulations.

#### PERMIT – ISSUANCE

- **6**(1) Every application for a permit for work shall be on the form provided by the local authority, and shall be accompanied by plans and specifications of the proposed building and work in a format acceptable to the local authority.
- (2) Every permit application shall be reviewed and approved by the building official including plan review and approval.
- (3) If the work described in an application for a permit, to the best of the knowledge of the local authority or the building official, complies with the requirements of this building bylaw, the Act, or the regulations, the local authority or the building official shall, on receipt of the required fee, issue a permit on the form provided by the local authority. In addition, one set of the approved plans and specifications will be returned to the owner or the owner's representative with the permit.
- (4) A permit issued pursuant to this building bylaw must include:
  - (a) the name of the person, or company to whom the permit is issued;
  - (b) the period for which the permit is valid;
  - (c) a statement of all fees, deposits or bonds charged for the permit;
  - (d) the scope of work authorized by the permit;
  - (e) the municipal address or legal description of the property on which the work described in the permit is located;
  - (f) the buildings or portion of buildings to which the permit applies;
  - (g) the stages of construction for which a permit holder must inform the local authority;
  - (h) any conditions that the permit holder is required to comply with; and
  - (i) any information required by this building bylaw.
- (5) No person or company to whom a permit is issued pursuant to the Act shall fail to comply with the terms and conditions of the permit.
- (6) Work must not commence before a permit is issued.

- (7) The permit fee shall be calculated according to the sum of the following:
  - (a) a permit administration fee listed in a fee bylaw for the processing, handling and issuance of a permit;
  - (b) the fees for plan review, field inspection of construction and enforcement in accordance with a fee bylaw or the agreement between the provider of building official services and the local authority;
  - (c) the fees charged by the Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency; and
  - (d) a deposit, if required, in an amount determined by the local authority.
- (8) If a deposit is collected it shall, on request by the owner or owner's representative, be refundable on satisfactory completion of the work or on approval of use or occupancy of the building by the local authority or the building official.
- (9) All permit fees and deposits will be collected before the permit is issued and are subject to any applicable taxes.
- (10) The local authority or the building official may establish the value of construction for the work described in an application for a permit, for the purpose of calculating a permit fee, based on established current construction costs, the owner's or the owner's representative statement of costs or constructor's contract values, or similar methods selected by the local authority or the building official.
- (11) It is the responsibility of the owner or the owner's representative to ensure that all notifications required by Section 7 of the Act and this building bylaw are given to the local authority and that all inspections are scheduled and completed. Failure to do so may result in additional fees for follow up inspections.
- (12) The owner or the owner's representative will be invoiced by the local authority for additional inspection fees and payment of the inspection fees will be due on receipt of an invoice. Unpaid inspection fees will be considered a debt due to the local authority and may be recovered from the owner of the land or premises in or on which the work was carried out as per the Act.
- (13) The local authority may, at its discretion, rebate a portion of a permit fee or deposit where work is reduced in scope or discontinued, or where other exceptional circumstances occur.

#### **PERMITS - REFUSAL TO ISSUE**

- 7(1) The local authority may refuse to issue a permit if:
  - (a) the proposed work described on the permit application would contravene:
    - (i) the Act;
    - (ii) the regulations;
    - (iii) an order of the appeal board;
    - (iv) a written interpretation of the minister pursuant to section 8 of the Act; or
    - (v) the local authority's building bylaw;
  - (b) the person who designed or reviewed the design of a proposed building that is within the scope of Part 9 of the NBC is not a competent person;
  - (c) the person who designed or completed a design review of a proposed building that is within the scope of Part 3, 4, 5, 6 or 7 of the NBC is not an architect or engineer;

- (d) the person who designed or completed a design review of a proposed building that is within the scope of the NECB is not an architect or engineer;
- (e) the application for a permit is incomplete;
- (f) any fees, deposits or bonds required pursuant to the local authority's building bylaw for the issuance of a permit have not been paid; or
- (g) the proposed work described on the permit application would contravene any other Act, regulations or bylaw that applies to the proposed work.
- (2) Where the local authority refuses to issue a permit pursuant to subsection (1), the local authority shall:
  - (a) provide written notice to the applicant as to the reasons for the local authority's refusal to issue a permit; and
  - (b) refund any fee or deposit paid as part of the permit application for work pursuant to the Act, less any fees paid for:
    - (i) plan review; and
    - (ii) permit application or administration.

#### **PERMITS - REVOCATION**

- 8(1) The local authority may revoke a permit issued pursuant to the Act:
  - (a) if the holder of the permit requests in writing that it be revoked;
  - (b) if the permit was issued on mistaken, false or incorrect information;
  - (c) if the permit was issued in error;
  - (d) subject to subsection (2), if, after 6 months after the permit's issuance, the work for which the permit was issued has not, in the opinion of the local authority's building official, been seriously commenced and no written agreement for the delay has been given by the local authority; or
  - (e) subject to subsection (2), if the work for which the permit was issued is, in the opinion of the local authority's building official, substantially suspended or discontinued for a period of more than 6 months after the permit's issuance and no written agreement for the delay has been given by the local authority.
- (2) If the local authority revokes a permit pursuant to subsection (1) it shall provide written notice to the permit holder as to the reasons for the revocation.

#### **PERMITS – EXPIRY**

- 9(1) The expiry of a permit does not relieve the owner or the owner's representative from the obligation to complete the work approved in the permit.
- (2) All permits issued pursuant to this building bylaw expire on the date stated in the permit, or if no date is stated:
  - (a) twenty-four months from date of issue;
  - (b) six months from date of issue if work is not commenced within that period;
  - (c) on the date specified by the local authority if work has not seriously commenced and is suspended for a period of six months; or
  - (d) on the date specified by the local authority if work has been suspended with written permission by the local authority or building official and the agreed upon period has been exceeded.

- (3) An owner or the owner's representative that does not complete all the work listed on a permit before the permit expires shall apply to the local authority that issued the permit to do one of the following:
  - (a) revoke the permit;
  - (b) extend the term of the permit;
  - (c) vary the conditions of the permit.
- (4) The local authority may revoke, extend or vary the conditions of a permit on written application of the permit holder and subject to any condition or fees listed in the bylaw.

#### **ENFORCEMENT**

10 The local authority or the building official may take any measures as permitted by section 24, 25 or 26 of the Act and sections 13 and 14 of *The Building Code Regulations* for the purpose of ensuring compliance with this building bylaw.

#### **NOTIFICATION**

- ${f 11}(1)$  The owner or the owner's representative of a building to be constructed shall ensure that the local authority is notified of:
  - (a) when excavation is to be commenced;
  - (b) when the foundation is to be placed;
  - (c) when a superstructure is to be placed on the foundation;
  - (d) any other event at the time required by the permit under which work has been undertaken; and  $\frac{1}{2}$
  - (e) any other specified event at the specified time.
- (2) Before commencing work at a building site, the owner or the owner's representative shall give notice to the local authority of:
  - (a) the date on which the owner or the owner's representative intends to commence the work; and  $\frac{1}{2}$
  - (b) subject to subsection (8), the name, address and telephone number of:
    - (i) the constructor or other person in charge of the work;
    - (ii) the designer of the work;
    - (iii) the person or firm that is to review the work to determine whether or not the construction conforms to the design; and  $\frac{1}{2} \int_{-\infty}^{\infty} \frac{1}{2} \left( \frac{1}{2} \int_{-\infty}^{\infty} \frac{1}{2} \left$
    - (iv) any inspection or testing agency that is engaged to monitor the work.
- (3) During the course of construction, the owner or the owner's representative shall give notice to the local authority of:
  - (a) subject to subsection (8), any change in, or termination of, the employment of a person or firm mentioned in clause (2)(b);
  - (b) the owner's or owner's representative intent to do any work that has been ordered by a building official or local authority to be inspected during construction;
  - (c) the owner's or owner's representative intent to enclose work that has been ordered by a building official or local authority to be inspected before enclosure;
  - (d) subject to subsection (8), any proposed deviation from the plans approved and permitted by the local authority;

- (e) subject to subsection (8), any construction undertaken that deviates from the plans approved and permitted by the local authority; and
- (f) the completion of work.
- (4) Subject to subsection (8), the owner or the owner's representative of a building under construction shall give notice to the local authority of:
  - (a) any change in ownership or change in address of the owner or the owner's representative that occurs before the issuance of a certificate of occupancy as soon as the change occurs; and
  - (b) the owner's or owner's representative's intention to occupy a portion of the building if the building is to be occupied in stages.
- (5) The owner of a building or the owner's agents, contractors, employees, successors or assigns or the registered owner of the land on which the building is situated shall submit a written report to the local authority of the occurrence of any of the following that causes or has the potential to cause serious injury or loss of life:
  - (a) structural failure of the building or part of the building;
  - (b) failure of any equipment, device or appliance that is regulated by the Act or the regulations.
- (6) A report submitted pursuant to subsection (5) must:
  - (a) contain:
    - (i) the name and address of the owner;
    - (ii) the address or location of the building involved in the failure;
    - (iii) the name and address of the constructor of the building; and
    - (iv) the nature of the failure; and
  - (b) be submitted to the local authority within 15 days after the occurrence of the failure mentioned in clause (5)(a) or (b).
- (7) On receipt of the report pursuant to subsection (5), the local authority may require an owner to do the following:
  - (a) provide any other information that the building official or local authority may consider necessary;
  - (b) complete any additional work that is necessary to ensure compliance.
- (8) Notice given pursuant to clause (2)(b), (3)(a), (3)(d) or (3)(e) or subsection (4) is to be in writing.

#### **SPECIAL CONDITIONS**

- **12**(1) An owner or the owner's representative that undertakes to construct or have constructed a building that is within the scope of Parts 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 of the NBC shall have an architect or engineer complete the design or design review of:
  - (a) the design or design review of the building and all building systems;
  - (b) an inspection of construction of the building and all building systems to ensure compliance with the design; and
  - (c) the reviews required by the NBC.

- (2) An owner or the owner's representative that undertakes to construct or have constructed a building with a structure within the scope of the NECB shall have an architect or engineer complete:
  - (a) the design or design review of the structure;
  - (b) a field review of construction of the structure to ensure compliance with the design; and
  - (c) the reviews required by the NECB.
- (3) In addition to the requirements of subsections (1) and (2), the local authority or building official shall require that an engineer or architect provide:
  - (a) a Commitment for Field Review letter as part of the permit application for work; and
  - (b) an Assurance of Field Review and Compliance letter, on completion of the work, providing assurance that the work conforms to the engineer's or architect's design.
- (4) An owner or the owner's representative that undertakes to construct or have constructed a building that is within the scope of Part 9 of the NBC shall ensure that a competent person has designed or reviewed the design of the building.
- (5) An owner or the owner's representative shall ensure that copies of any inspection or review reports made pursuant to this section are made available to a building official or the local authority on the request of the building official or local authority, as the case may be.
- (6) No owner of a building or an owner's representative shall cause or allow the ground elevations of a building to be changed so as to place in contravention of the NBC:
  - (a) the building or part of the building; or
  - (b) an adjacent building.
- (7) If the property boundaries of a building lot are changed so as to place a building or part of a building in contravention of the NBC, the owner or the owner's representative shall immediately alter the building or part of the building to bring it into compliance with the NBC.

#### PENALTY

- **13**(1) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this building bylaw may be subject to the penalties provided in Part 8 of the Act.
- (2) Conviction of a person or corporation for breach of any provision of this building bylaw shall not relieve the person or corporation from compliance with the Act and regulations.

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14 On enactment of this building bylaw, all previous building bylaws, including building bylaw amendments, are repealed.

Please be advised that the municipality's 2025-26 Municipal Revenue Sharing (MRS) grant has been withheld.

As of May 20, 2025, the municipality has not submitted the Declaration of Eligibility for its MRS grant or has reported non-compliance with one or more of the eligibility requirements (see the attached infographic). Submission of the declaration was due to the Ministry of Government Relations (ministry) by January 31, 2025. Municipalities that become compliant with eligibility requirements after submission of their declaration are required to notify the ministry, as outlined in the Declaration of Eligibility Guide found at the following link: <a href="https://publications.saskatchewan.ca/#/products/108169">https://publications.saskatchewan.ca/#/products/108169</a>. Once the municipality notifies the ministry of its compliance with all eligibility requirements, the MRS grant will be paid to the municipality, in due course.

In 2025-26, the Government of Saskatchewan will distribute more than \$361 million to municipalities in MRS. This is the equivalent of .75 of one full point of Provincial Sales Tax (from 2023-24 Public Accounts).

Of the \$361 million to be distributed to the pools, \$58.257 million will be allocated to the towns, villages, and resort villages.

The total 2025-26 MRS grant for your municipality is \$ \$41,526 . The grant distribution formula for towns, villages and resort villages is comprised of a base grant of \$2,025 plus a per capita grant of \$294.78, based on 2021 Statistics Canada census populations, including revisions. Census figures will be updated once the 2026 Census information is available.

Grant payments consist of one, four or eight installments based on the total grant amount. Payments will be made on the 15th day of the month, with the eighth and final payment, if applicable, made on December 31, 2025. The following table summarizes the payment frequency:

Less than \$100,000	1	Jun 15
\$100,000 to \$250,000	4	Jun 15, Aug 15, Oct 15, Dec 15

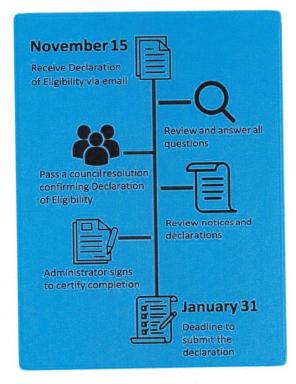

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# Municipal Revenue Sharing

In 2025-26, the Government of Saskatchewan will distribute more than \$361 million to municipalities in Municipal Revenue Sharing. This is the equivalent of 0.75 of one full point of Provincial Sales Tax (from 2023-24 Public Accounts).

This commitment represents an increase of more than \$234 million, 184 per cent, over 2007-08. This level of commitment aligns with the Government of Saskatchewan's promise to develop a long-term revenue sharing plan with the municipal sector that is linked to the performance of the province's economy.

For 2025-26, \$172.255 million or 47.9 per cent is allocated to the cities, \$58.257 million or 16.2 per cent to towns, villages and resort villages, \$102.490 million or 28.5 per cent to rural municipalities, and \$26.611 million or 7.4 per cent to northern communities.

In calculating the 2025-26 Municipal Revenue Sharing (MRS) grants, the 2021 Census figures were used. This ncludes 2021 Census Revisions. Census figures will be updated once the 2026 Census information is available.

# 1. Municipal Revenue Sharing Grant Eligibility Requirements

The Ministry of Government Relations (ministry) implemented annual eligibility requirements for municipalities to receive their unconditional MRS grants starting in the 2019-20 grant year. There are six eligibility requirements municipalities must meet to receive their MRS grant:

- 1. Submission of the Audited Annual Financial Statement to the ministry;
- 2. Submission of the Public Reporting on Municipal Waterworks to the ministry (if applicable);
- 3. Ensure Education Property Taxes (EPT) are in good standing, with respect to EPT reporting and remittance;
- 4. Adoption of a **Council Procedures Bylaw**;
- 5. Adoption of an Employee Code of Conduct; and
- 6. Filing and annually updating Public Disclosure Statements from all members of council, as required.

# 1a. Declaration of Eligibility Process

Each year, municipalities report their compliance with the eligibility requirements to the ministry by completing an online Declaration of Eligibility form. This process helps the ministry determine if municipalities have met the eligibility requirements for their MRS grant.

On or around November 15 of each year, all municipalities are asked to complete an online Declaration of Eligibility for the MRS grant. The online form must be completed and submitted to the ministry by January 31.

NOTE: A complete declaration requires a resolution of council confirming the municipality meets the eligibility requirements.

## 1b. Missed Deadlines or Outstanding Eligibility Requirements

Municipalities that do not submit the ministry's Declaration of Eligibility form by January 31 each year will see all of their MRS grant withheld. In addition, municipalities that are not in compliance with one or more of the eligibility requirements will also see their MRS grant withheld, until compliance is achieved.

If a municipality does not meet all of the eligibility requirements, it is its responsibility to take all required steps to meet each of the requirements and notify the ministry. Once the ministry is informed that a municipality meets all the requirements, its previously withheld MRS grant will be released, unless otherwise notified.

   The 2025-26 distribution for the cities is \$249.86 per capita based on the current 2021 census populations.
- Towns, Villages and Resort Villages
   The 2025-26 distribution for the towns, villages and resort villages is a \$2,025 base amount, plus \$294.78 per

capita based on the current 2021 census populations.

### 4. Rural Municipalities

There are three components to the Rural Revenue Sharing grant as follows:

#### **Unconditional Grants**

The formula bases the grant on a combination of transportation/roads related data (70 per cent) and a per capita amount calculated using the most current available Canada Census figures (30 per cent). Earlier taxable assessment and roads data is used to finalize calculations earlier in the year to provide rural municipalities with estimates sooner for budget planning purposes. First Nations roads are accommodated within the existing formula by adding the roads passing through First Nations to the calculation and utilizing the same road classes and per kilometre rates applicable to other rural municipality roads in the formula.

The Revenue Sharing grant for the Rural Municipality (RM) of Lakeland No. 521 will be calculated as an exception to the formula described above. The formula used for towns, villages and resort villages will apply and will still be paid from the RM funding pool. This formula was implemented to address the RM's similarities to urban municipalities relating to lack of rural roads relative to total population.

#### **Organized Hamlet Grants**

The 2025-26 distribution for organized hamlets is 60 per cent of the base amount for towns, villages and resort villages (\$1,215) plus 60 per cent of the per capita amount for the towns, villages and resort villages (\$176.87) based on the current 2021 census populations.

As they are not incorporated, grants are paid to the rural municipality on behalf of the organized hamlets.

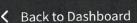

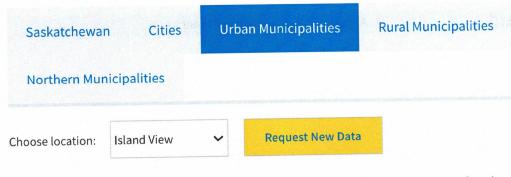

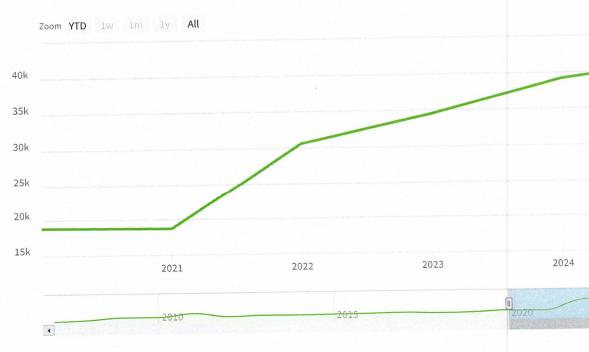

**RE: 2025 Education Property Tax Mill Rates** 

On behalf of the Honourable Eric Schmalz, Minister of Government Relations, and as announced in the March 19, 2025, provincial budget, the education property tax mill rates to be levied with respect to every school division and property class for the 2025 taxation year are as follows:

1.07 mills
4.27 mills
6.37 mills
7.49 mills

As in past years, municipalities will collect education property taxes and remit the revenue to the province, except for municipalities with separate school divisions that set their own mill rates.

Separate school divisions must inform the Ministry of Education and all municipalities within their boundaries of their 2025 education property tax mill rates by May 1, 2025.
